

With this Newsletter is a leaflet introducing Norwich Bikewatch, a scheme devised by Norwich Cycling Campaign and funded by the Safer Cities project and Norwich Union.

It is a voluntary registration scheme designed to reduce cycle theft in Norwich where it is at almost epidemic proportions.

Last year, over 1,700 cycles were stolen in Norwich. Nationally, nearly 600,000 bikes are stolen each year but the chances of getting your bike back are as low as 1 in 300.

Similar schemes in Oxford and Lewisham have reduced those odds to 1 in 30!

Cycle theft is a considerable deterrent to cycling, so any measures that reduce cycle theft can only help promote more cycling.

The underlying principle of Bikewatch is that if you make it more difficult for a thief to dispose of a stolen bicycle then it becomes less attractive to steal it in the first place.

So, please register your bike(s) today by filling in the form in the leaflet and returning it to us by FREEPOST to this office.

Priority for cyclists and walkers

To the Letters Page, Eastern Evening News, 6-4-96

Norwich Cycling Campaign welcomes the cycling aspects of the Government Green Paper on transport. In particular, we welcome the National Cycle Strategy to be launched in July.

But while we are pleased to see the target of doubling cycle use by 2002, we are sceptical that this can be achieved without a major input of Government funding.

Local authorities traditionally bid for Government funding as part of the transport policies and programme process, but their bids are almost invariably capped by the Treasury.

Consequently, many worthwhile schemes, which would encourage more people to cycle, are all too often delayed or cancelled.

Schemes promoting cycling and walking should be exempt from Treasury capping and any required savings should be made from the road-building budgets.

The green paper does show that 60% of all car journeys are less than five miles – ideal cycling distance. In urban areas the promotion of cycling and walking is the best way of reducing congestion and pollution.

What is needed now is for cycling and walking to be given priority over other transport modes.

York prioritises cycling. There, 20% of journeys are made by cycle compared to 8% in Norwich and just 4% nationally.

It's BIKE to WORK day!

How do you get to work?



Hopefully by bicycle. Naturally you have long known about the benefits of commuting by bike. It's cheap, quick, convenient, healthy and non-polluting. Unfortunately not everyone thinks the same. Nearly 75% of all journeys made in this country are less than five miles in length and two-thirds of all car journeys are less than 3 miles -typically journeys to work, school, shops, etc.


These journeys are ideal for cycling, given the right facilities which the Norwich Cycling Campaign has been working to obtain, with a fair degree of success, since 1990.

So, on Wednesday 5th June why not leave the car at home and cycle to work instead. Have your bike checked over at one of our Dr. Bike Safety Checks, work out a favourable route from the Cyclists Route Map of Norwich, pump up the tyres and off you go.

Also, if you send us a letter from your employer confirming that you cycled to work on Wednesday you will be entered in a Prize Draw with prizes for the first three cycle-commuters drawn from the hat.

Having cycled to work once, why not do it regularly? Employers know that cyclist employees are healthier than most, take less time off with minor ailments, are more punctual and are generally more alert and aware than their car-driving colleagues. Yet they don't provide anywhere to lock up a bicycle safely. If you find you like cycling to work, why not persuade your boss to provide a cycle rack or two. A guide for employers who wish to become cycle-friendly can be obtained from our office in Exchange Street.




Memorial Bike Rack a fitting tribute

Terry Storer was a great campaigner for CAMRA (the Campaign for Real Ale) and an enthusiastic local cyclist. He was known, among other things, for losing bikes from outside pubs – on one or two occasions they were moved by 'friends' – so his reputation for having bikes stolen grew.

He travelled frequently by plane to visit friends in Austria and even on flights his jinx with bikes stayed with him. On one occasion Terry could only watch helplessly from the airport window as his bike fell from a luggage trailer — and was squashed by an empty trailer making its way in the opposite direction!

When he died, three years ago, the Norwich and Norfolk



Branch of CAMRA decided that a memorial bike rack would be placed outside a pub. The only remaining question was, which one?

After years of much digression, discussion and disagreement, I took up the cudgels. A small committee was formed and a decision taken that I would approach Chris Higgins at the Trafford Arms. It could be argued that Terry would not have visited this particular pub with Chris as landlord, but he was a regular customer at the Horse and Dray when Chris was the landlord there.

An agreement was reached and the bike rack is to be placed outside the Trafford Arms. The unveiling of a plaque in memory of Terry will take place at the end of the celebratory Terry Storer Mass Cycle Procession on Saturday 8th June at about 12:30pm.

Meet at St. Peter Mancroft Church at 11:00am for an 11:30 start to this City Centre Ride to the Trafford Arms. There will be prizes for the best decorated bikes and I hope everyone will come into the pub and drink to Terry. I also hope that on this special occasion the bike rack will be full to overflowing!



Schools competition

As part of National Bike Week, Norwich Cycling Campaign is inviting local school pupils to take part in a competition on the theme of cycling. 
